Scott McCormick is currently the lead trainer and program manager for CARD (Collaborating Agencies Responding to Disasters), located in Alameda County, California.

CARD coordinates, trains and supports community service organizations in disaster preparedness, response and recovery activities. CARD also serves as lead and fiscal agent for several other preparedness programs serving the counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco and San Mateo.

Prior to working directly with CARD, Scott was the disaster preparedness and emergency services liaison at Eden Information and Referral. As supervisor of their Information Management department, he oversaw Eden I&R's program to track government and nonprofit service programs in Alameda County, and connected people in need with the resources to help them. Scott has presented to hundreds of community members on topics such as personal preparedness, organizational response, special needs in disaster planning and strategies for collaboration among community, business and government partners in times of disaster. Some of his special projects at CARD include the development of public outreach tools such as CARD's website, [WWW.FIRSTVICTIMS.ORG](http://WWW.FIRSTVICTIMS.ORG), the Captive Audience education program and the Pocket Skills Training initiative.

Scott is a member of the Alameda County Medically Fragile Working Group, addressing the sheltering needs of medically fragile residents of Alameda County. He is also a member of the California Emergency Services Association, the Emergency Managers Association, and the Board of Directors of the Bay Area Chapter of the Alumni Association of the College of William & Mary.

Scott has worked with the American Red Cross as a preparedness trainer, First Aid and CPR instructor, and local and national disaster responder through local chapters, national headquarters, and the AmeriCorps program, the Rapid Response Corps.

His other work in the community has been with educational programs in different California cities, seeking to bring more opportunity to children in under-funded school systems.
